Policy Statement:

Temporary registration may be granted by the Registration Committee to allow a professional who is registered or licensed in another jurisdiction in any of the Designated Health Professions of Audiology, Hearing Instrument Dispensing or Speech-Language Pathology to engage in temporary and limited practice in B.C., specifically related to the education or training of others.

The Registration Committee will grant Temporary registration only for the duration reasonably required in the specific circumstances, up to a maximum of 90 days.

Temporary registration will not be granted for the purposes of engaging in general practice or educating or training other professionals for periods longer than 90 days.

Renewal of Temporary registration

Renewal of Temporary registration may be granted by the Registration Committee prior to the expiry of the initial Temporary registration period, for an additional period of up to 90 days.

In determining whether to grant renewal, the Registration Committee may consider factors such as the reason(s) for renewal of registration — including any new purposes for Temporary registration — and the Temporary Registrant’s compliance with the parameters of their Temporary registration during the initial period.



1. Policy Rationale and Purpose:

The Temporary registration class is reserved for educational and training purposes only and is not intended for general practice.

The Registration Committee is responsible for reviewing and, where appropriate, granting applications for Temporary registration under Schedule 8, 5.0 of the CHCPBC Bylaws. Its powers and duties include:

- Determining whether the conditions and requirements for Temporary registration are met,
- Deciding whether to grant Temporary registration and for what period (up to 90 days),
- Defining which activities may be demonstrated for educational or training purposes, and
- Deciding whether to grant renewal of Temporary registration and for what period (up to 90 days).

This policy further defines the parameters of the Temporary registration class and the Registration Committee's discretion with respect to Temporary registration.

2. Policy Scope:

This policy applies to Applicants to the Designated Health Professions of Audiology, Hearing Instrument Dispensing and Speech-Language Pathology in the registration class of Temporary.
