Notice of Order

On June 30, 2026, the Deputy Registrar of the College of Health and Care Professionals of BC (“College”) made the Disciplinary Order (“Order”) set out below relating to the Respondent.

Reasons for Order

On February 27, 2025, a complaint (“Complaint”) was made about the Respondent.

Following an investigation, the Investigation Committee assessed the allegations raised in the Complaint. The Committee found that it had reasonable grounds to believe that the Respondent lacked competence and/or had committed acts of misconduct.

The Committee found that the Respondent had failed to exercise appropriate professional judgment, ensure the accuracy of professional communications, remain within the limits of the available information and scope of practice, and appropriately manage their role in matters affecting custody and access proceedings.

The Committee determined that it would be appropriate to dispose of the concerns identified by directing the Deputy Registrar to make the Order set out below with the Respondent’s consent under Section 158(2)(b) of the *Health Professions and Occupations Act*.

The Order was consented to and signed by the Respondent on July 13, 2026.

Order

Pursuant to the Decision of the Investigation Committee dated June 10, 2026, the Deputy Registrar hereby disposes of the Complaint by making the following orders:

Dispositions with Respondent’s Consent (HPOA ss. 158(2)(b)):

- A disciplinary order that requires the Respondent, on or before a specified date, to undertake specified education, training or other remedial activities as set out below (HPOA s. 269(d)(iii)).
 - Within six months of any future re-licensure, the Respondent undertakes to successfully complete the following, at the Respondent’s expense:
 - PROBE: Ethics & Boundaries Program.
- A disciplinary order that suspends a respondent's practice authority for a specified period or until a respondent complies with specified conditions as set out below (HPOA s. 270(1)(b)).
 - The Respondent’s practice authority is suspended for a period of six months to commence upon any future re-licensure.
